# **GLOBAL LEARNING SEMESTER**

Emerge as an international citizen with a broad international perspective and deep China insights.

The DKU Global Learning Semester (GLS) is a world-class, innovative liberal arts education for highly qualified students from all backgrounds worldwide. The program is ideal for students who seek interactive classroom discussions, thrive on engagement with faculty and peers outside the classroom, and display a natural curiosity about the diversity of the world's cultures. Students choose from a variety of interdisciplinary courses that will spark curiosity and cultivate critical thinking skills.

This semester-long program, offered in both fall and spring semesters, features courses in global health, the humanities, social sciences, the physical and natural sciences, English writing, and Chinese language instruction. Classes are taught in English by faculty from Duke University and Duke Kunshan University. DKU students also enjoy access to extensive online resources from the Duke University Libraries. Students successfully completing the program will receive Duke University course credits that can be transferred to other degree-granting institutions. Furthermore, students who successfully complete the program will be offered the opportunity to attend Duke University Summer Session in Durham, North Carolina, USA.

# **PROGRAM DETAILS**

### Eligibility

- Undergraduate students currently enrolled at universities in China and around the world.
- ▲ GPA of 3.0 or above, or ranked in the top 25% of your class.
- Demonstrated English proficiency (CET, TOFEL or IELTS scores can be submitted as reference, but an interview may be required).

## Academic Environment

- DKU professors are highly innovative teachers and leaders in their fields. Students benefit from small class sizes of 12-25 students, one-on-one feedback, guest lecturers, live teleconference discussions with international experts, and field trips in the historic Kunshan and Shanghai regions.
- Research and service learning are essential to the curriculum, providing students first-hand knowledge and

### **Program Timeframe**

The DKU Global Learning Semester is divided into two, 7-week sessions, for a total of 14 weeks of study (approximately 4 months). Students have a choice of fall or spring

experience with the topics they are learning about in class. Faculty mentors prepare students for graduate school, and career counselors provide guidance in pursuing meaningful careers.

 All courses are taught in English, with the exception of Chinese language courses.

# Credit & Transfer

- Students who successfully complete the program will receive Duke University course credits that can be transferred to other degree-granting institutions.
- Students select four intensive for-credit classes per semester according to their personal interests and course requirements at their home institutions.

# Opportunities

- Students who successfully complete the program will be offered the opportunity to attend 1 to 2, 4-6 week intensive for-credit classes in the Duke University Summer Session in Durham, North Carolina.
- Career counselling provides guidance to help you plan for meaningful careers and take advantage of opportunities for internships and future jobs.
- Extra-curricular activities, civic engagement, and travel options help develop your cultural awareness and find meaning in your work by helping others.

- <sup>3.</sup> Two required essays in English written by the applicant.

  A) Explain why you are interested in the opportunity to participate in the undergraduate DKU Global Learning Semester.
  B) Choose one:

• Tell us about your cross-cultural experience, either internationally or within your own country or community. What were your greatest challenges? What did you learn from the experience, about yourself and working with others?

• Discuss how you hope to benefit intellectually from the DKU Global Learning Semester, which aims to educate students to be informed global citizens with broad world views and deep China insights.
